

Neutral/ Strongly Strongly Unsure disagree






About four in ten Australians agree that religion is good for Australian society and about the same number are neutral or unsure.









About a quarter of Australians report having had a mystical or supernatural experience. A third know someone who has or believe it could happen.






Three in ten Australians say they pray or meditate at least once a week.
